There is a new funding advice portal on the East Riding Data Observatory website. Created by the data observatory team, with information from colleagues in regeneration and funding, the website responds to an increasing need to provide up-to-date information to support funding applications.

The website at http://dataobs.eastriding.gov.uk/fundingadviceportal has four elements :

- tips and guidance when preparing a funding application
- an overview of key statistics
- useful links that can help when you prepare a funding bid
- links to GRANTnet the world-leading free-to-use funding search website.

There is also a map of the East Riding electoral wards - double-clicking on a particular ward will open a profile of that area for you.

The website provides evidence that is typically required for funding applications, but there is lots of other information too. First release of Census 2011 data

First released in July, data from the 2011 Census shows that the East Riding population is estimated to be 334,200 - an increase of 6.4 percent since the 2001 Census. The number of households is 143,000 - an increase of 8.5 percent

Although our population has increased by 20,100 since the last Census, the number of those aged between 0 and 4 has dropped by 3,400 or 6.2 percent. The biggest increase in our population is for those aged 65 or over - an increase of 13,700 or 24.1 percent (from 57,700 in 2001, to 71,500 in 2011).

Crime reporting

Police in the East Riding are reminding residents to report any suspicious behaviour immediately. Leaving a long delay between witnessing an incident and reporting it can mean the difference between a criminal being caught and getting away.

Detective Sergeant Emma Heatley said: "In one incident, a known burglar was seen acting suspiciously, entering the garden of an address. He was also seen some weeks prior to this but was not reported.

"If this information had been reported to us at the time, the police could have taken immediate action."

Help the police to help you by reporting any suspicious activity on the non-emergency number 101 - use 999 in an emergency.

Rural pubs boost

Over 300 rural pubs have been invited to think about this initiative which is backed by East Riding of Yorkshire Council and the Big Lottery Fund.

The launch event is on Tuesday, 9 October 2012 in the members pavilion at Driffield Showground. The event will be opened by Councillor Jane Evison, and will outline how the scheme works.



Rural strategy update

The East Riding of Yorkshire Rural Strategy 2013-2016 is being finalised on behalf of the East Riding of Yorkshire Rural Partnership and the council.

A six-week public consultation between the end of April and beginning of June involved a range of organisations. Six awareness-raising events were held across the East Riding so that parishes and residents could contribute to the process. The response was very encouraging - over 900 comments were received. These were analysed and changes included in the strategy.

The final document has been submitted for approval by both the East Riding of Yorkshire Council and the East Riding of Yorkshire Rural Partnership. Preparations are being made for its formal launch on Friday, 9 November 2012 at Bishop Burton College. Roos 'RES' pre-construction fund

This small grants scheme, available within Roos parish, received two donations of £5,000 each from RES UK & Ireland Limited. The money will be spent during the construction of the wind farm at Sunderland Farm.

The fund panel of ward members, parish councillors and residents recently visited the wind farm site to see the construction work. After touring the site, the panel considered applications to the fund and agreed these awards:

- Roos playing field association £400 for a new cooker and hob so sports teams and spectators can have hot refreshments
- Friends of Roos School £444.91 towards the cost of external lighting, banners, popcorn machine and other equipment for school events.

RES UK & Ireland Limited has committed to make annual donations of £2,000 per megawatt of installed wind farm capacity into a new fund which will have a broader area of benefit. This fund will start one year after commercial operation starts.

Sancton Hill wind farm

An open day on Saturday, 6 October from 10am – 4pm gave people the chance to see inside a working wind turbine, and see how the wind farm was built. Refreshments were available and proceeds donated to a local charity. The event also allowed residents to find out about the community fund, and provided lots of other activities for all the family.







Waterways Strategy launch

The rivers, canals and streams of the East Riding and North Yorkshire area add a lot to its attractiveness and prosperity, and to the quality of life of residents. They are important for a multitude of reasons, including navigation, nature, heritage, flood management, trade and recreation.

Fifteen inland waterways within the boundaries of the East Riding and North Yorkshire Waterways Partnership are managed and maintained by a range of statutory agencies, independent trusts, navigation authorities and local amenity associations.

The partnership has developed a draft Waterways Strategy 2012-20, which sets out a long-term strategic approach to the economic, environmental and social regeneration of the inland waterways that fall within the Partnership area.

Statement of Community Involvement

The Draft Statement of Community Involvement is available for public consultation. It describes how the public can get involved in the preparation of the Local Plan, which will set planning policies, show how the East Riding will develop and grow in the next 15 years, and say how the council will consult the public when a planning application is submitted.

The Statement of Community Involvement needs updating because of changes to the way that planning documents are prepared. It will also allow the Council to take account of feedback from public consultations.

Check on your neighbour

Humberside Fire and Rescue Service is asking residents to take 10 minutes out of their day to check on an elderly neighbour.

Paul Clucas from Humberside Fire and Rescue said: "There are some simple steps that will reduce the risks of fire in the home, helping keep them safer from fire."

This includes:

- offer to check their smoke alarm is working
- if your neighbour smokes, suggest they do not smoke in bed
- remind them not to leave cooking unattended
- remind them to make sure the cooker is turned off after they have finished
- make sure they use a fire guard if they have an open fire
- remind them not to sit too close to portable heaters as fabric can catch fire.

Flu vaccination

It is very important that people who are at increased risk from flu have their free flu vaccination every year. It is a highly-infectious disease with symptoms that come on very quickly - colds usually start gradually, with a stuffy or runny nose and a sore throat.

The best way to avoid catching and spreading flu is to get protected, before the virus starts to spread, by having the vaccination. This year's vaccine protects against three types of flu virus. You should have the flu vaccination if you are: aged 65 years or over; living in a residential or nursing home; the main carer of an older or disabled person; or pregnant.

Even if you feel healthy, you should have the free flu vaccination if you have a condition like a heart problem, chest complaint, kidney disease or lowered immunity.

The flu jab is free, so consider making an appointment with your GP surgery. For more information about how to protect yourself and your family this winter visit nhs.uk/winterhealth
